ET110 Boardsmanship Basics

Especially designed for first-year board members, this 2.5-hour workshop, presented by TASB staff, is an overview of the job of a school board member. Participants will discuss how to handle the personal and public demands that come with their new job. They'll also learn the board's basic roles and responsibilities, and how their duties differ from those of the superintendent.

New and aspiring officers will learn the statutory legal duties, local policies, and expectations of board officers. ET150 Engaging in Equity Conversations to Improve Student Outcomes

What is equity? Why does it matter for student success? How do our history, beliefs, and perceptions impact our policy decisions? This session emphasizes the authority the school board has in its policy-making role and identifies how policies may unintentionally hinder a student's ability to be successful. It will help boards increase their ability to view policy work through an equity lens, allowing them to significantly impact the inequities that currently exist in our schools. It will empower boards to take the lead in eliminating barriers to student learning and ensuring equitable learning opportunities are available to all students.

Through experiential learning, this full-day workshop will help develop "you"—the leader from within. It will show you how servant-leadership equips individuals to help them become leaders with enhanced abilities capable of building community. ET210 4th Annual SLI Book Study (Homework Required!)

In 2009, Simon Sinek started a movement to help people become more inspired at work, and in turn inspire their colleagues and customers. Since then, millions have been touched by the power of his ideas, including more than 28 million who've watched his TED Talk based on "Start with Why"—the third most popular TED video of all time. **This session requires advance reading.** Come join other school board members and share thoughts about why Sinek believes leaders who have the greatest influence all think, act, and communicate the same way. They all "Start with Why." *Books will be mailed in advance to those who register for this session, and pre-reading is expected. This is not suitable for on-site registration.*  

ET215 A Student's Story

This session is a story about a student in a district classroom with 17 other students that appear to be just like him/her. The story is told by trustees who have researched the true education challenges and fates of one class of students. Come learn and listen what happens to them from pre-kindergarten days to where they end up in society. You will be armed with information that will help you see the hurdles with achieving district visions and strategic goals. Learn about what the data says the chances are for this student to graduate and become successful. What factors do districts control and not control in the life of one student? Come see if the student makes it and what happens to the other 17 students. *This session presented by the Texas Caucus of Black School Board Members.* 🏠

ET220 School Board Governance: Top 10 Practices of Effective Boards

Trustees often hear about “good governance.” Unfortunately, many question what it means, what it looks like and most importantly, how to achieve it. The co-presenters, who are experienced trustees serving in leadership capacities in their community as well as on the TASB Board, will clarify the meaning of “good governance.” Help create a vision of what it looks like and provide practical ideas and an action plan for boards to achieve it! 🏠

ET225 Redefining Readiness in Your District

It's important for students to be passionate about their education and career choices. But getting a good job requires both passion AND preparation. So what constitutes preparation in this diverse engine of job growth we call the Texas economy? Do you understand the relationship between revenues and expenditures? What is the impact of local, state, and federal funding on your budget? Do you realize the impact of ADA vs. WADA on your budget? Stop in and listen to how the Lancaster ISD (ESC 10; 7,052 ADA) superintendent and board analyzed and developed an action plan for understanding and preparing the district's budget. 🏛️

ET325 Superintendent Compensation: Straight Talk about a Sensitive Topic

The annual superintendent evaluation and compensation review is often a stressful event for board members and superintendents. Board members often lack information and resources necessary to evaluate superintendent compensation fairly. This session, presented by Dripping Springs ISD (ESC 13; 5,421 ADA), is designed to provide guidance to board members in preparing for and conducting superintendent compensation review with minimal stress. 🏛️

ET330 Advocating for Student Success and Equity: MASBA's Story

Responsible trustees want each and every student to succeed and have a rewarding and fulfilling life. Join this discussion with MASBA (Mexican-American School Board Members Association) leaders about what you can do in your district to maximize the learning of Mexican-American students, as well as each of your students. ET335 Point/Counterpoint

Just like a coin, almost every issue facing Texas public education has two sides or two distinct points of view. And sometimes, just like a coin, your opinion or position might flip. ET530 Aligning District Work to the New Governance Standards—Are You Ready?

We hear a lot currently about how important excellence in governance is for school board members. TEA, under the leadership of Deputy Commissioner A.J. Crabill, is offering training across our state to help trustees develop a framework for effective governance. But what does this look like in a given school district? ET630 Top 10 Things You Should Know about Risk Management

With constant changing rules and requirements for educating students, it is no wonder that trustees may not know how the district manages risks faced each day. Yet, risk can have a significant impact on whether a school can successfully navigate the journey of graduating students. This session will provide insight into what important information a board member should know and how this knowledge will help in making better-informed risk management decisions.  

ET635 Taming School Discipline When Every Minute Counts

School districts face multiple issues related to discipline. In this session, board members and administrators will learn more about three major types of behavior they address: disruptions, off-task, and unsafe behaviors. Discipline impacts student performance, and it is essential that schools address behavior to increase student performance. This session will provide background to these issues and information on how to address them.
