Anne Sung Short Biography

Since joining the Houston ISD Board of Education in January 2017, Anne Sung has worked to strengthen college and career readiness standards, wrap-around services, special education, and the district's audit department. Anne Sung previously served as Chief Strategy Officer at Project GRAD Houston, an educational non-profit that partners with schools, cities, colleges, and businesses to help thousands of students to develop and achieve their college and career goals. Trained as a physicist at Harvard University, Anne fell in love with teaching as a young Teach for America corps member in the Rio Grande Valley and continued her career as a high school teacher for 8 years. In Houston, her home town, Anne taught at Lee (now Wisdom) High School serving immigrant-rich Gulfton, where she served as chair of the science department and was the 2011 Teacher of the Year. She co-founded the grassroots organizing group Community Voices for Public Education to give Houston students, parents, educators, and community members greater voice in public education. Anne was a founding board member of New Leaders Council - Houston. She is an American Leadership Forum Senior Fellow and serves on the board of OCA - Greater Houston, an APIA civil rights organization. Anne holds a B.A. and M.A. in Physics and a Master's in Public Policy from Harvard University.
