Bio for Rev. Scott Moore

Rev. Scott Moore currently serves as the First Vice President for the Conroe Independent School District Board of Trustees. Rev. Moore is also a member of the Board of Directors of the Texas Association of School Boards, representing Education Service Center Region 6. Scott was raised in East Texas and attended Lamar University in Beaumont, earning his Bachelor's degree in Political Science. He then attended Southern Methodist University, earning a Master of Divinity degree with honors. Rev. Moore is currently a PhD candidate (ABD) at Our Lady of the Lake University where he is completing his dissertation on the Relationship Between School Board Transformational Leadership and Classroom Educator Organizational Commitment.

Scott is a frequent presenter at conferences and conventions around the state where he trains school board members on leadership and governance. He has also developed a reputation amongst education advocates for his tireless work with other elected officials at the state and federal level. Rev. Moore has frequently testified before the House Public Education Committee, Senate Education Committee, and the State Board of Education. His advocacy efforts during the 87th Legislature helped bring national attention to the plight of dyslexic students and were part of the testimony preceding the State Board of Education's major revision of the Texas Dyslexia Handbook. Scott is frequently called upon to travel and provide training to school boards across the state.

Scott is returning to his first career as a law enforcement officer with the Trinity County Sheriff's Office. He is also returning to local church ministry where he will pastor Wesley Memorial United Methodist Church in Huntsville beginning July 1, 2022.
